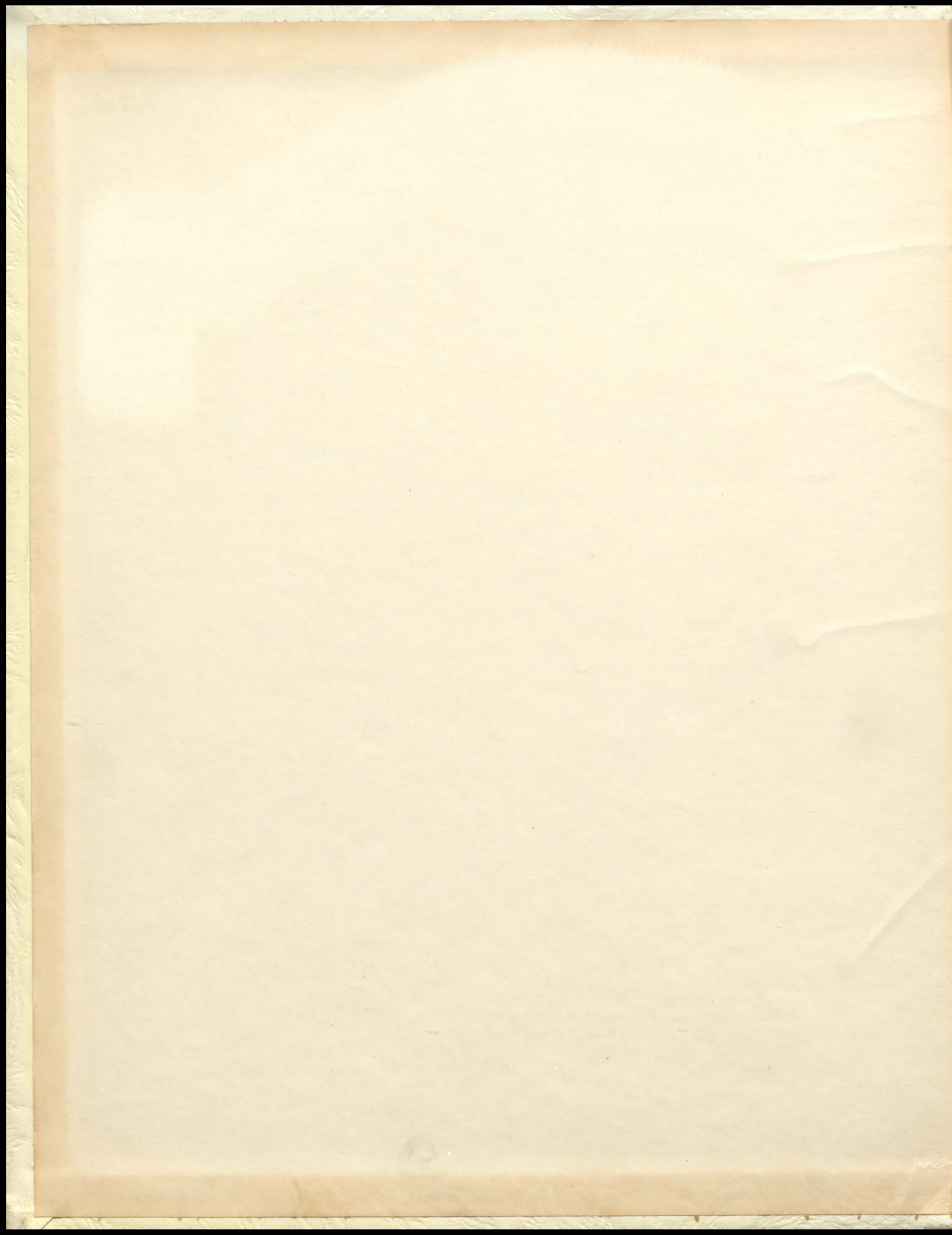

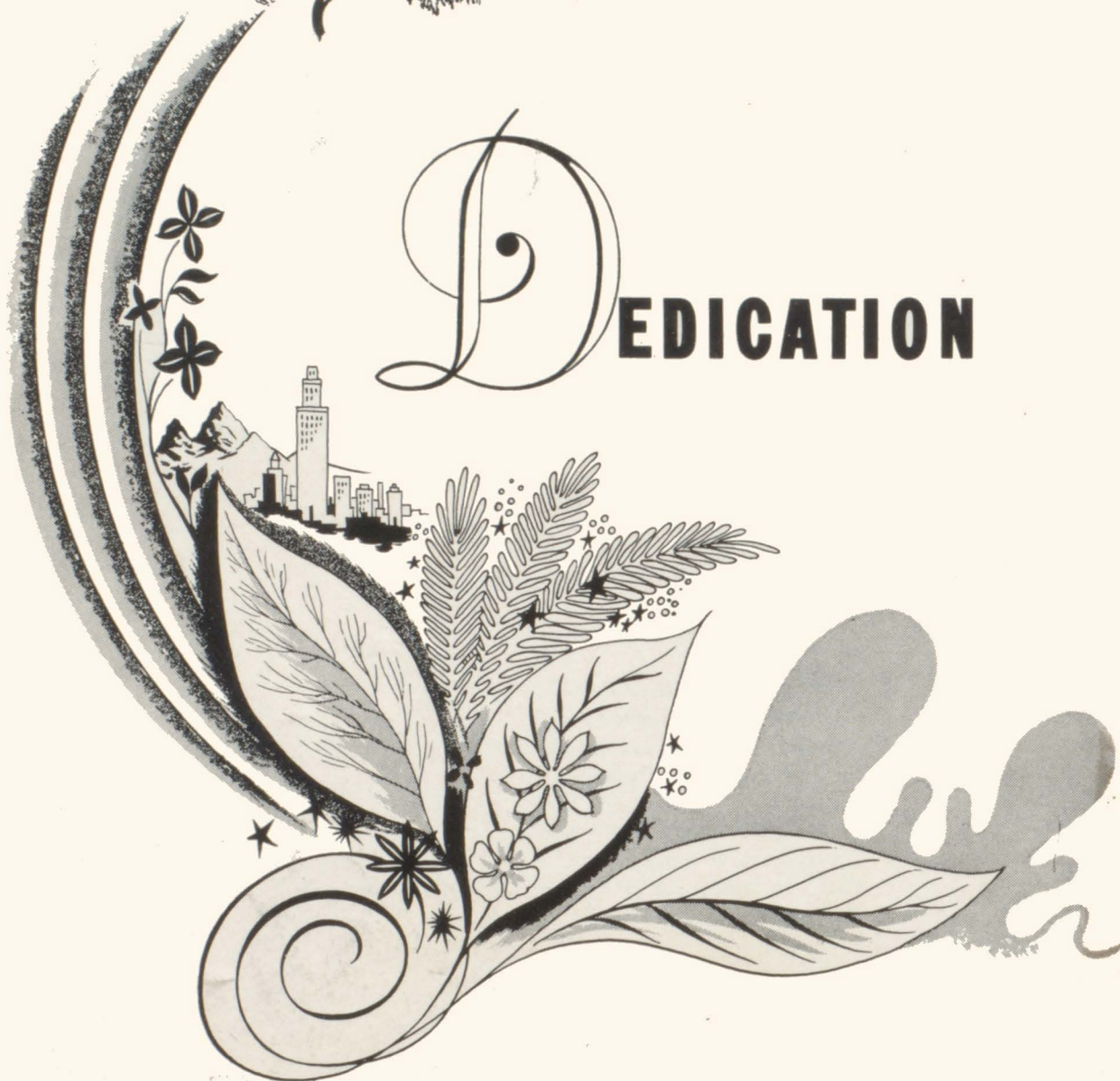

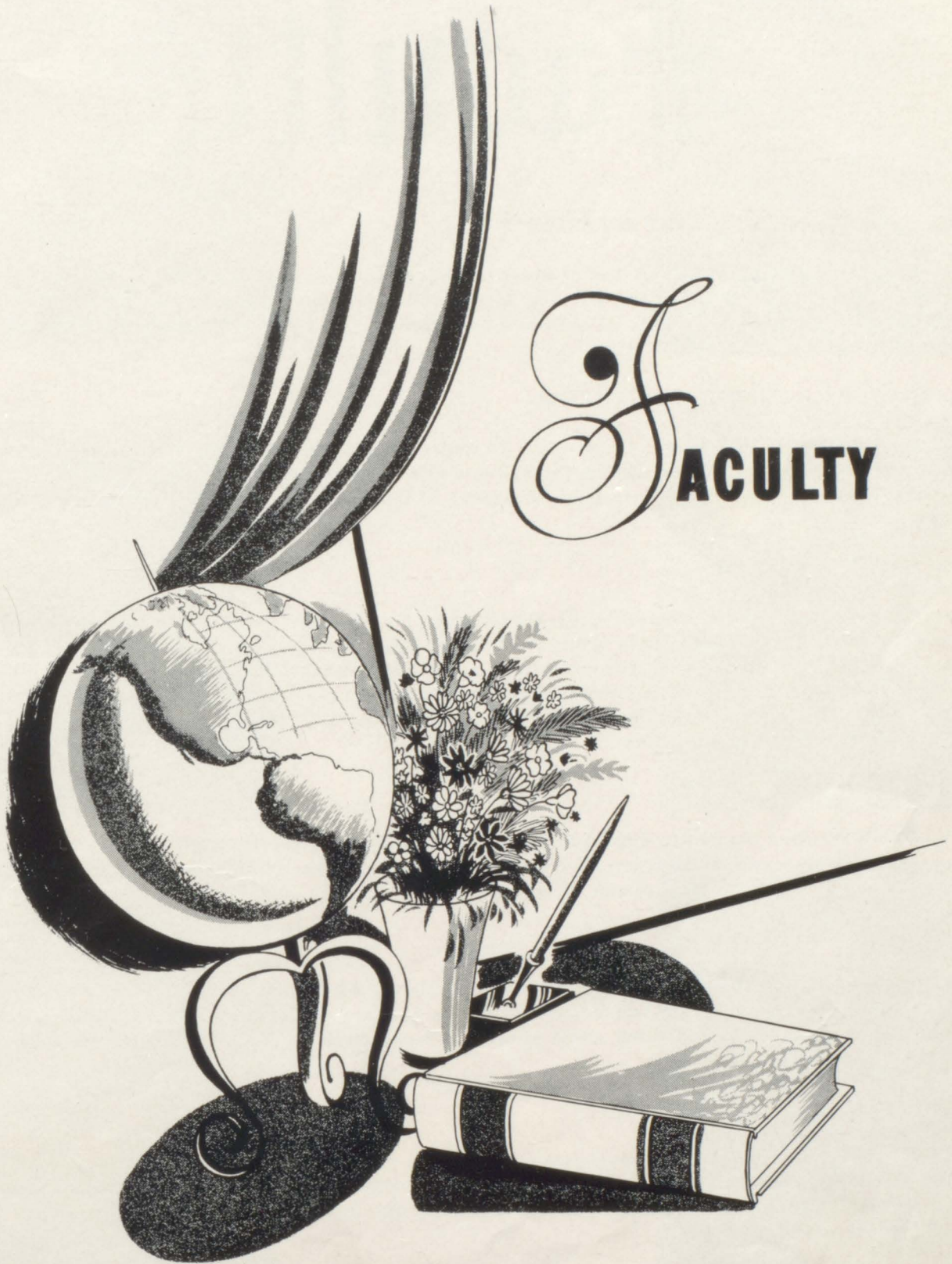

Mr. Buck Harris and his helper, Terry. Mr. Harris has been the custodian for one year and has done a fine job keeping the schoolhouse clean and warm.



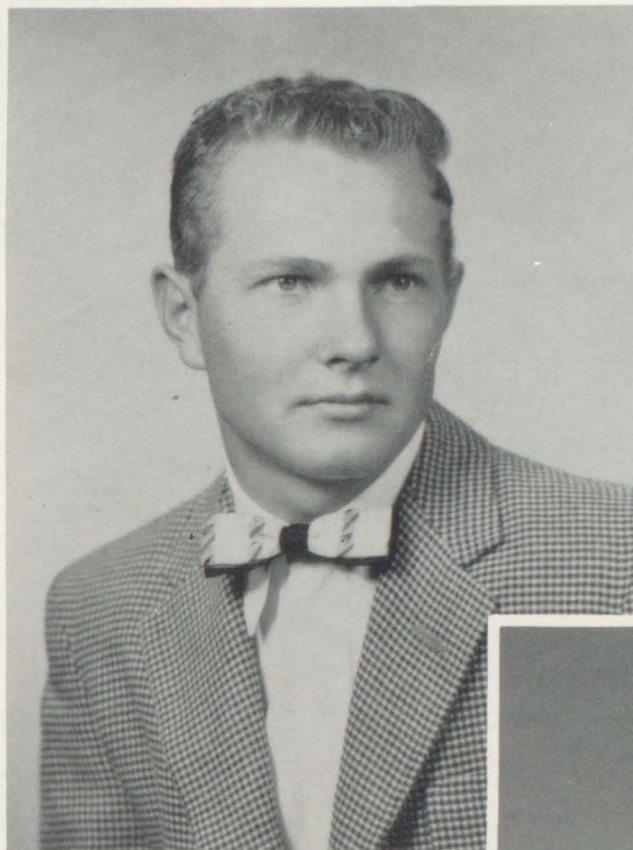
