We made it at last; we were the mighty Seniors. Our officers were: President, Larry Welsh; Vice President, Donna Durrett; Secretary-Treasurer, Rita Koch; Reporter, Marie Sarah. Our sponsor was Mr. Don Davis. We lost Barbara Welsh, Charlotte Ritchie, Gary Smith, and Donald Kerr.
