JR. HIGH FOOTBALL

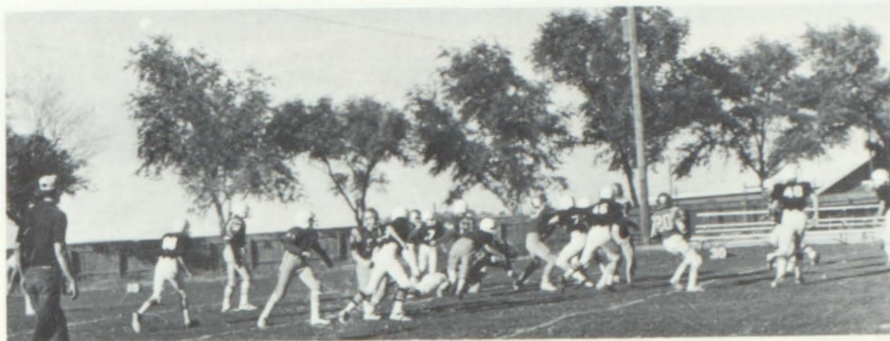

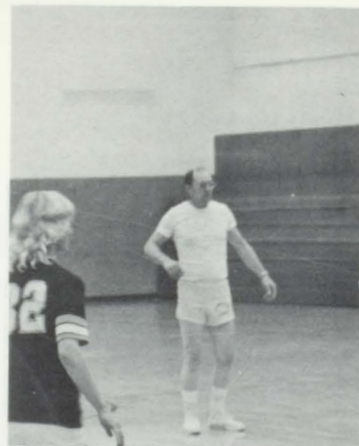
The sport of volleyball for the girls of EHS had a slow beginning. We had several hurdles to overcome before we could concentrate on the finesse of the game.

COACHES COMMENTS



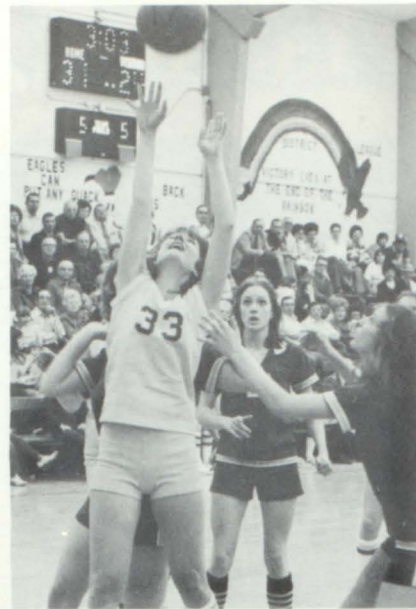
It has been a pleasure and a new experience working with the girls' basketball program. The team was young: one senior, three juniors and the remaining sophomores and freshmen.

The girls lacked basketball knowledge which comes from early introduction to basketball, grade school, junior high school and into high school. This being the first year of a girls competitive Junior High basketball program will be a great asset for the incoming freshmen.

Our shooting percentage increased throughout the season, 18% to 32.7% from the field. Our free throw percentage increased from 26% to 41%. Turnovers were a big reason for our losses, averaging 20 per game. Ball handling, passing, dribbling, shooting, driving, use of left and right hands, concentration, determination and will to win comes through constant practice on the part of the individual. Team work comes during formal practice. We used a person-to-person defense, 2-1-2 zone, 1-3-1 zone and a 3 person press this past season, ending up with a 10-7 season record, and a 2-1 tournament record.

More practice time will be needed. A 50-minute class scheduled during the day is not adequate to develop a good program. I feel the girls improved greatly during the season; and being a young team, the future looks very good for EHS.

I have welcomed the opportunity to coach again for Eads High. By giving our daughters a basketball instead of a doll, and working with them from the age of 2 the girls will become better shooters and their program will be parallel with the boys. I hope the girls have learned and enjoyed this past season, and are looking forward to the coming years ahead.

Their season record for varsity stands at fifteen (15) wins and two (2) losses, which primarily speaks for itself.

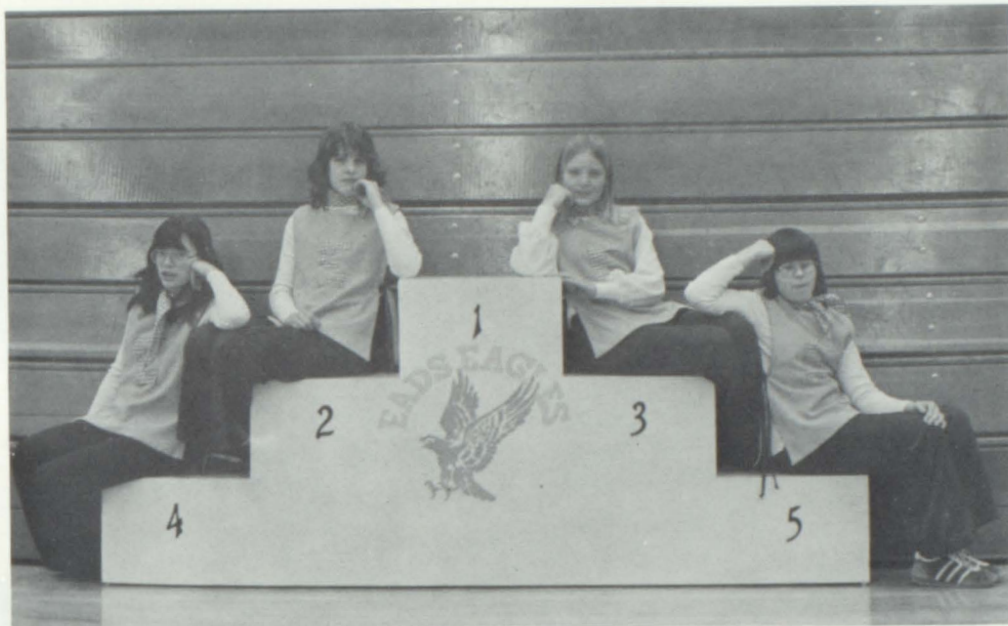

I wish to thank all those who supported our team and baseball program, and especially Mr. DeVaughn for keeping the scorebook and Mr. Hamby for assisting me as coach.

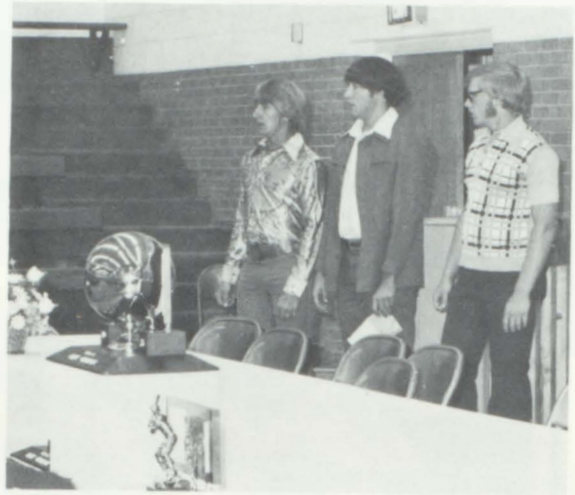
