The 1984 Plainview football season turned out to be a very unfortunate one for the Hawks.



Kindal Barnes received All-Conference while John Pimentel and Mark Scott received honorable mention.
























The PJH Football team was very young this year. The boys played only two games for the season. There were seven boys out for the sport, leaving the team with only one substitute.


The boys started off the season in a difficult game with Weskan that ended in a loss 47-21. The Hawk team took their second loss to a tough Kit Carson team 47-19.


