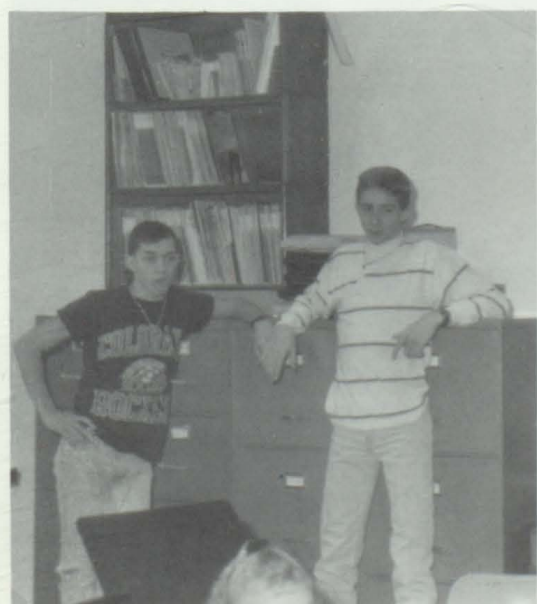

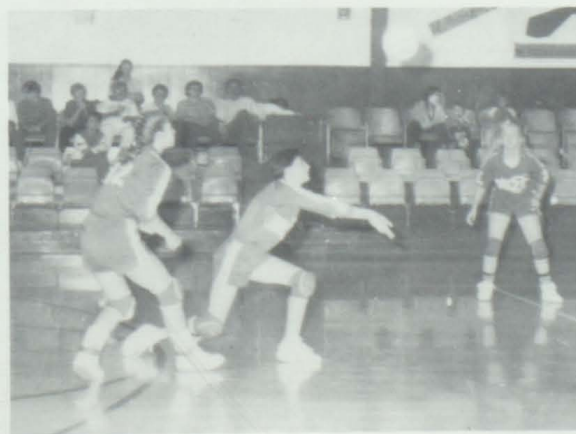

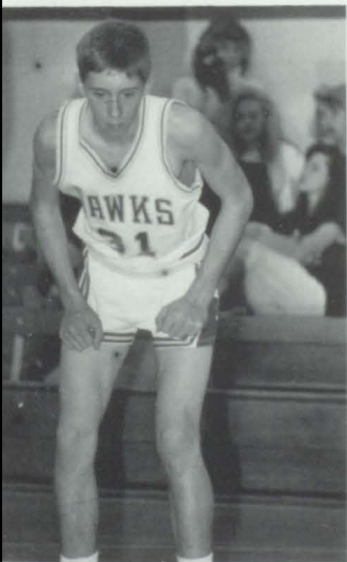

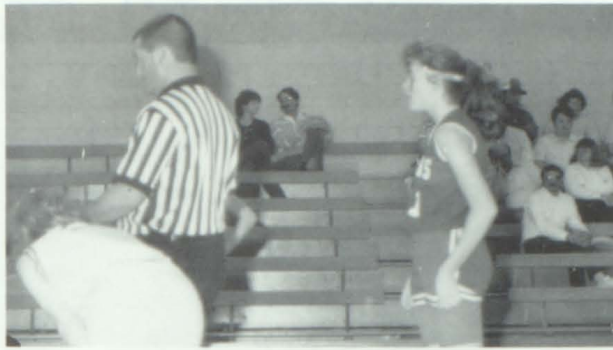

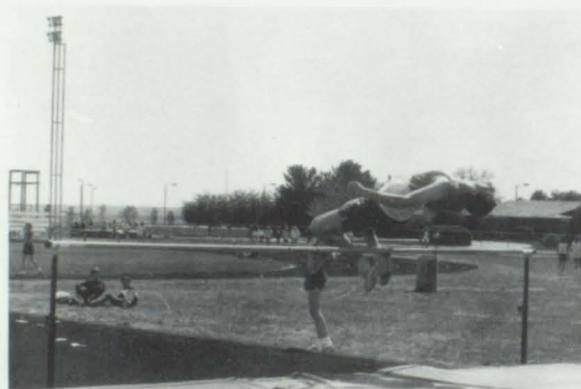


# SIX GO TO STATE

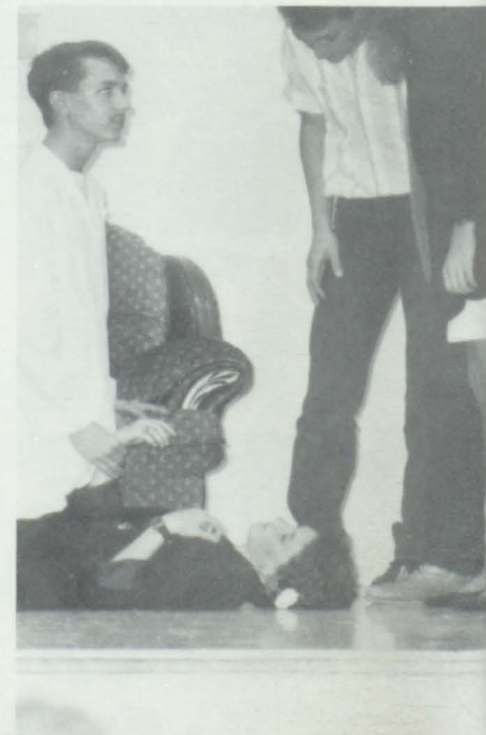

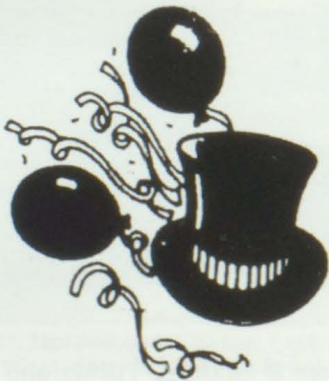


# 1991-92 Junior - Senior Prom

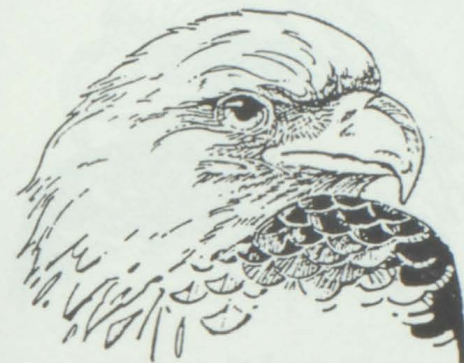

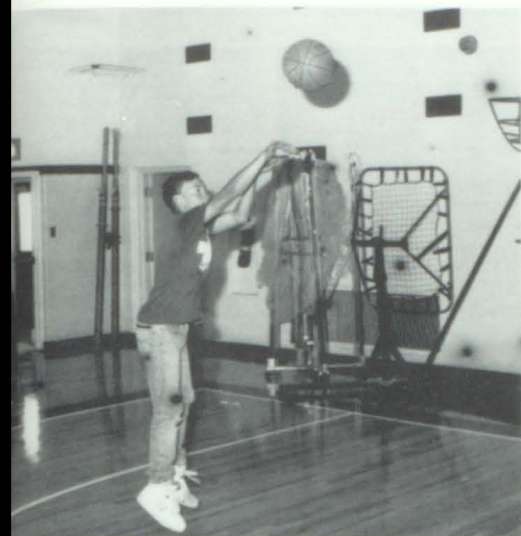

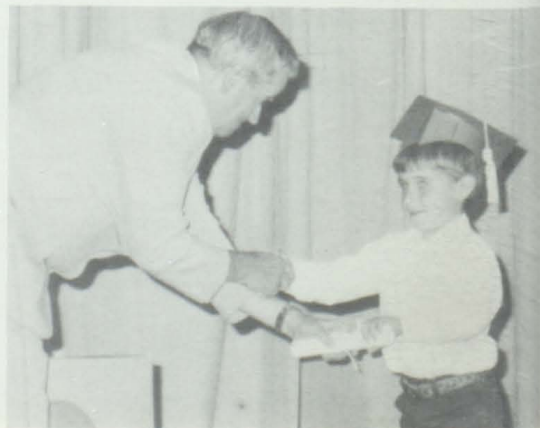

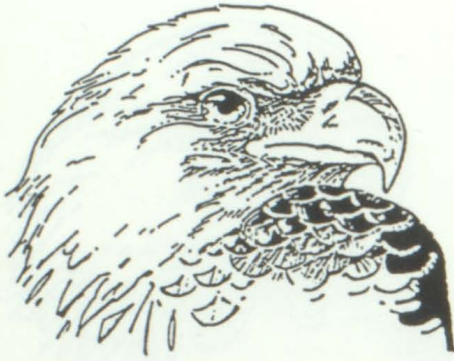
