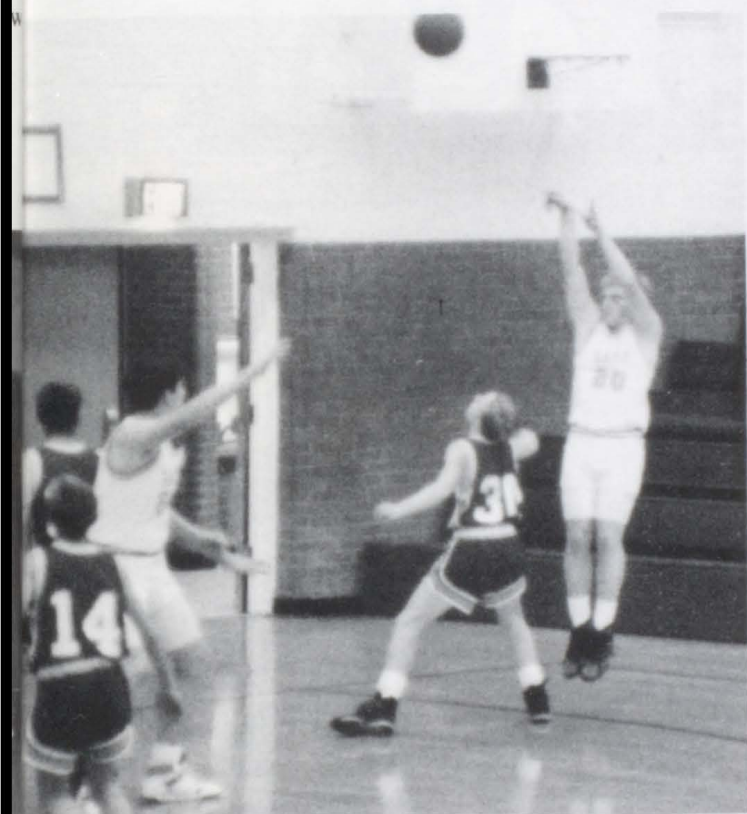

We were disappointed Heath Robertson was not able to participate this season due to a knee injury that happened just before the first practice date. He was missed. He did, however, give us good support from mat side.

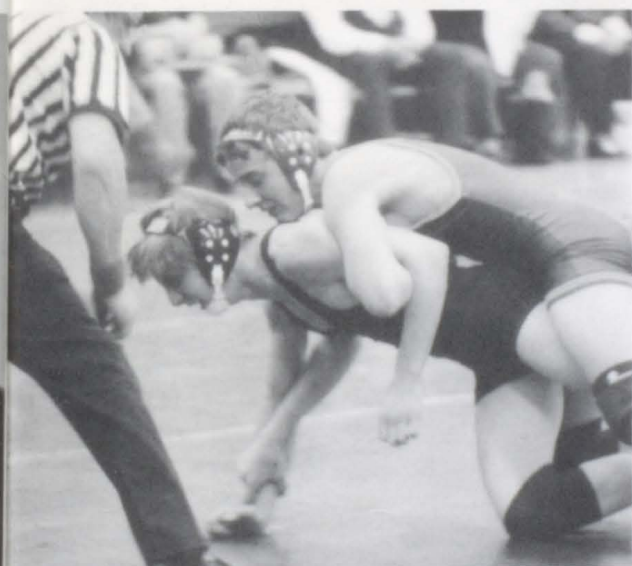

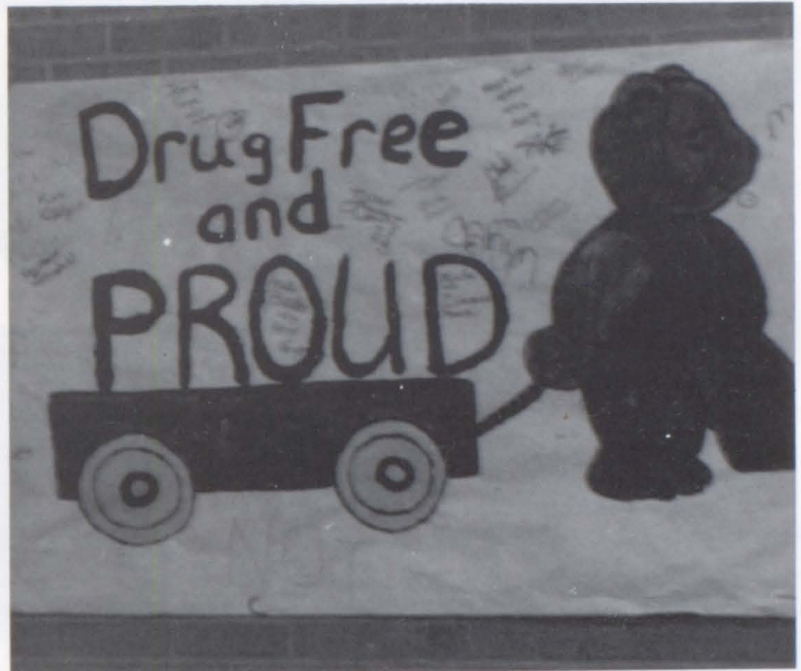
