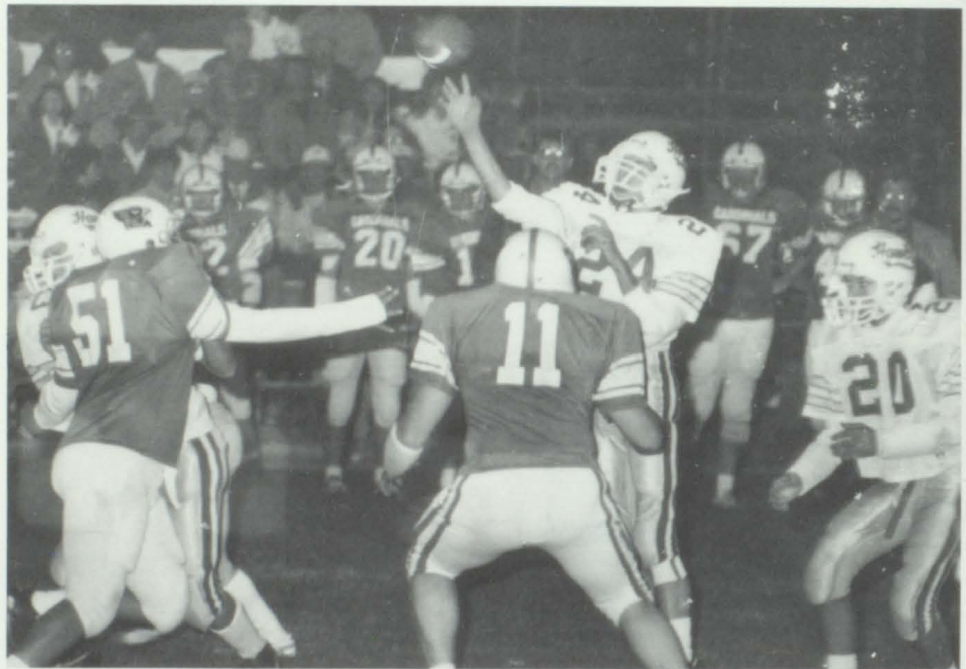

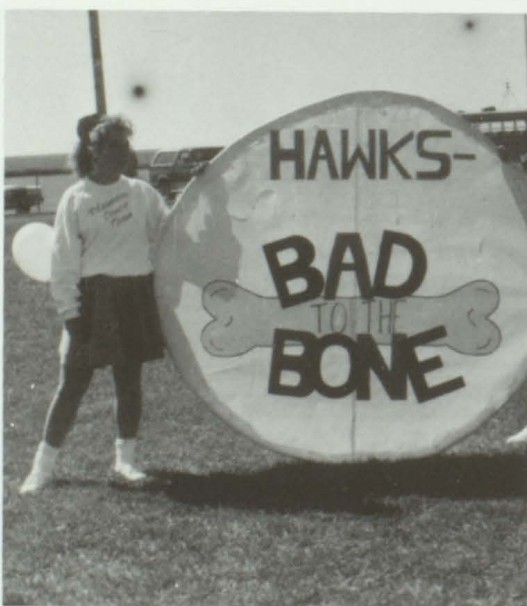

Hawks End Season With Record Of 4-12

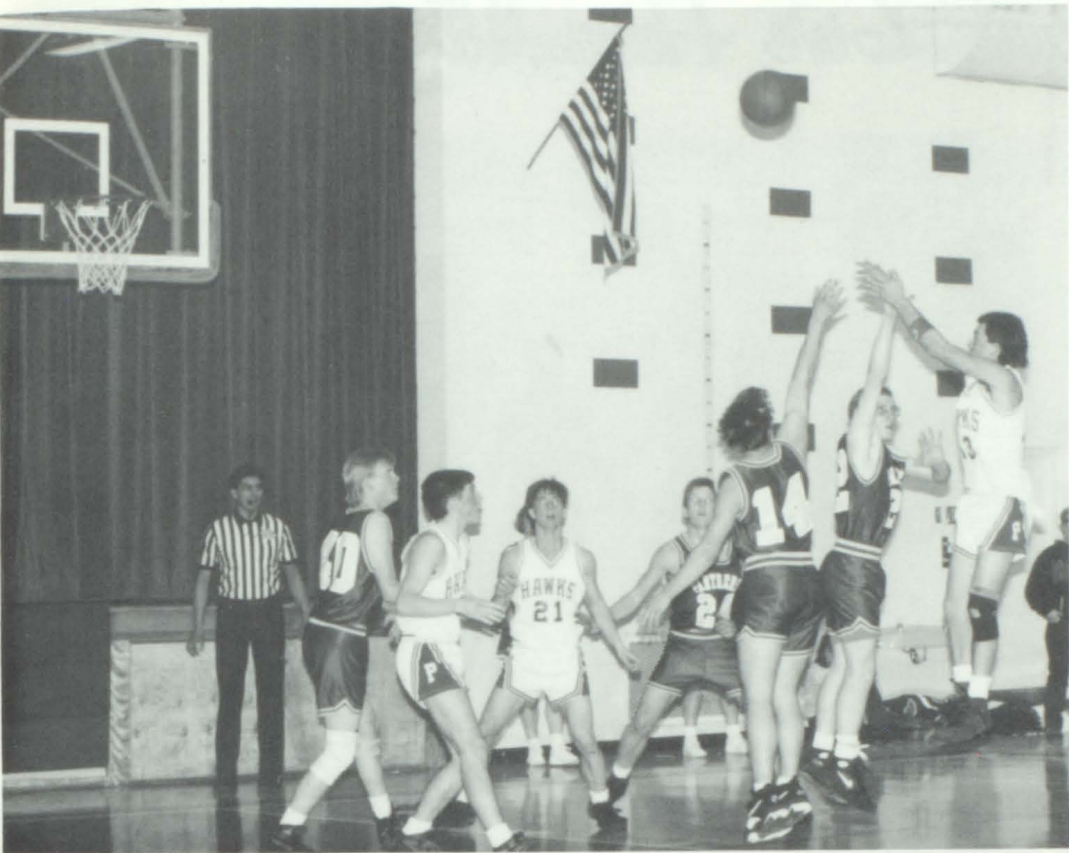

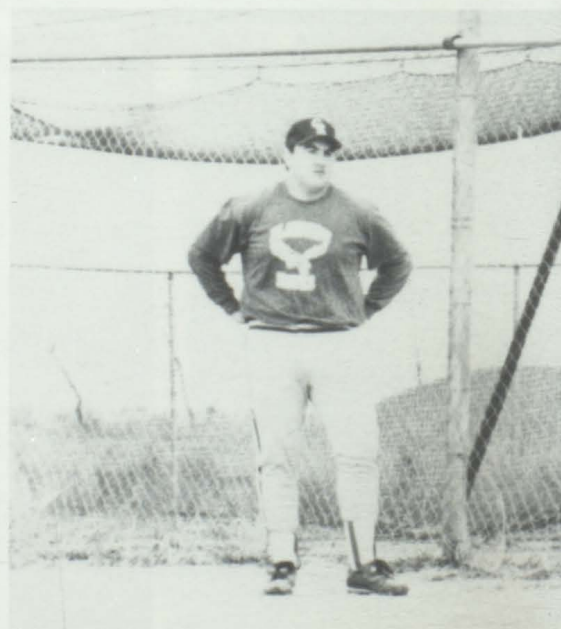

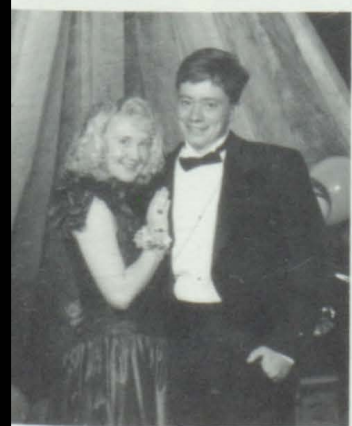

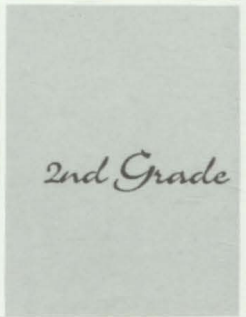
