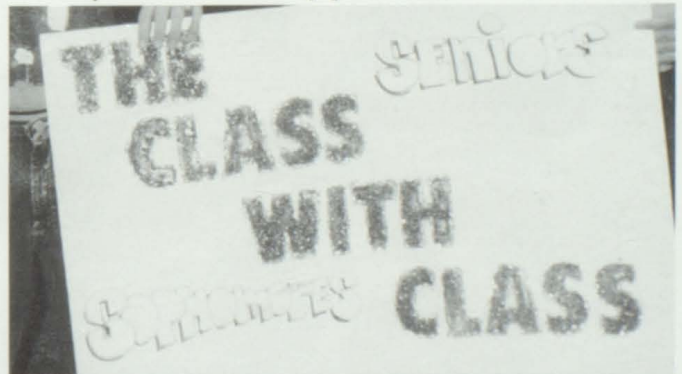
Bold, Brash and Bare

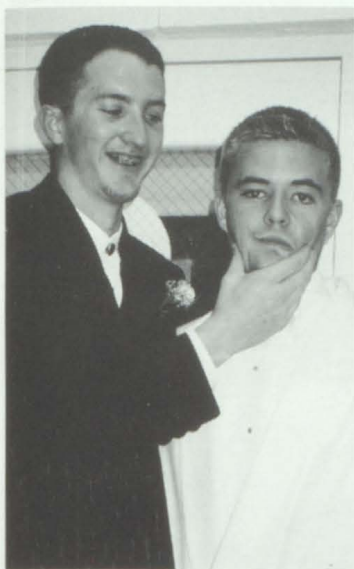

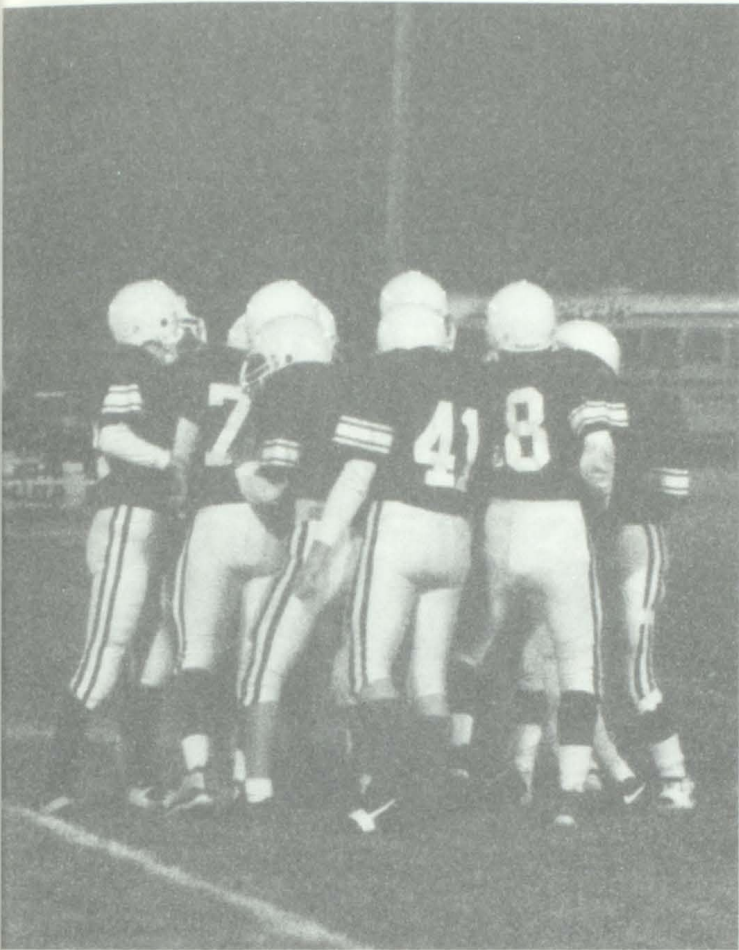

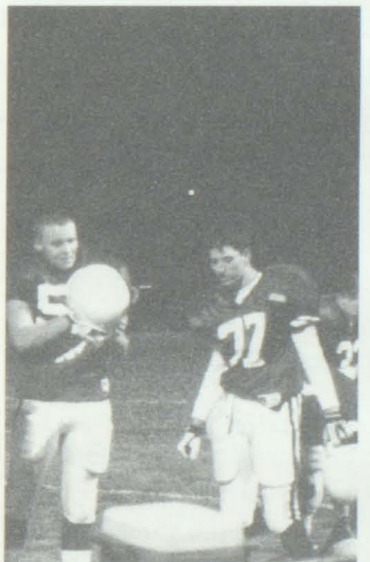

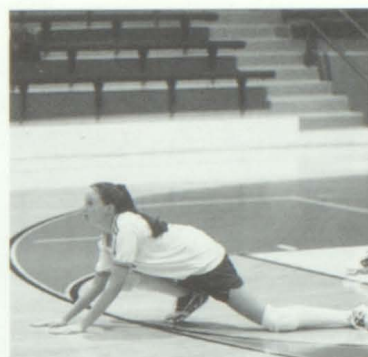

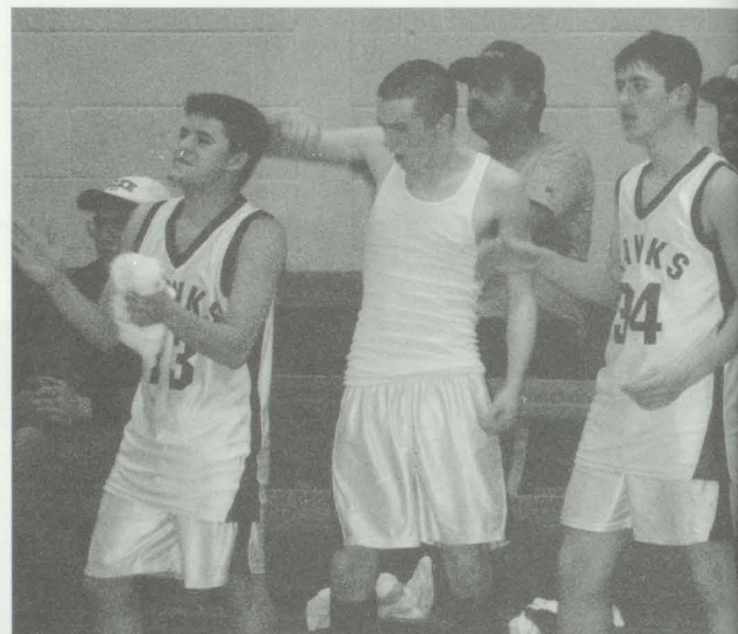

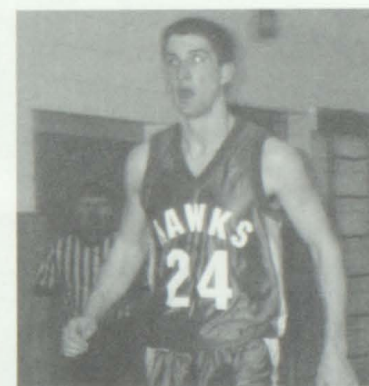
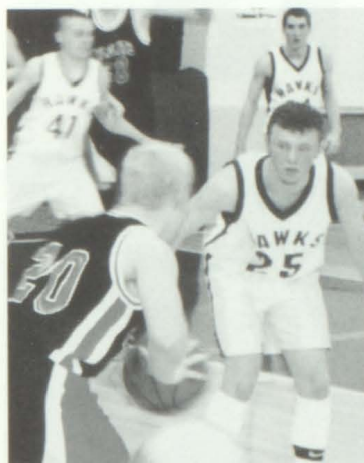
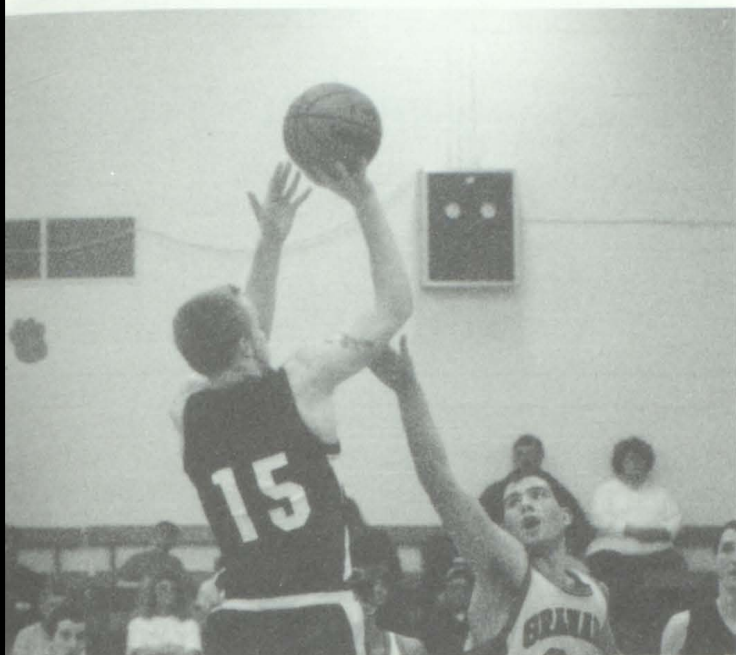
Season Overview

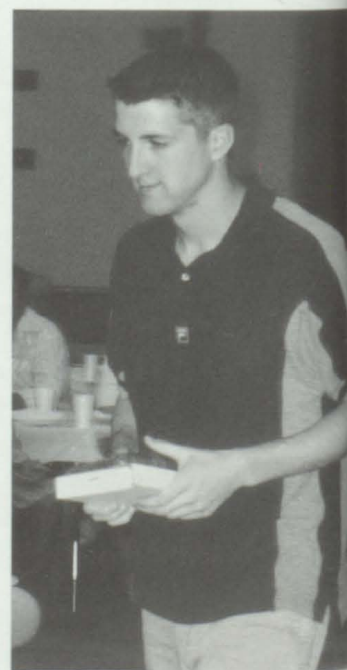

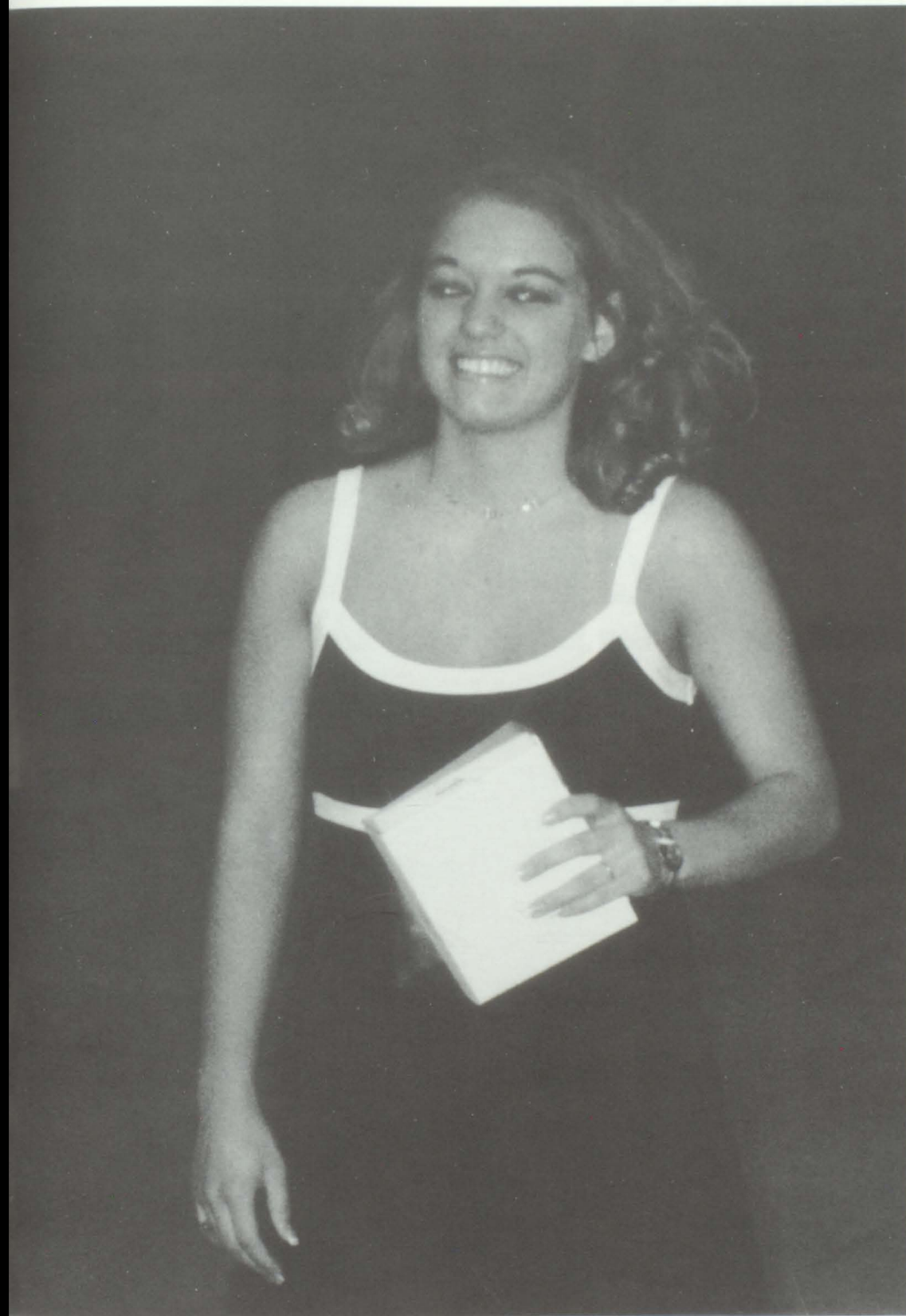
