



Top cutout: A new sign was also added to Plainview School thanks to a Department of Local Affairs grant applied for by Mr. Coulter and aided by senior Vincent Koeller. 
It's a sign: New Floor=New Look













SCIENCE FAIR WAS ON FEBRUARY 11, 2010.








Junior High and High School Knowledge Bowl








