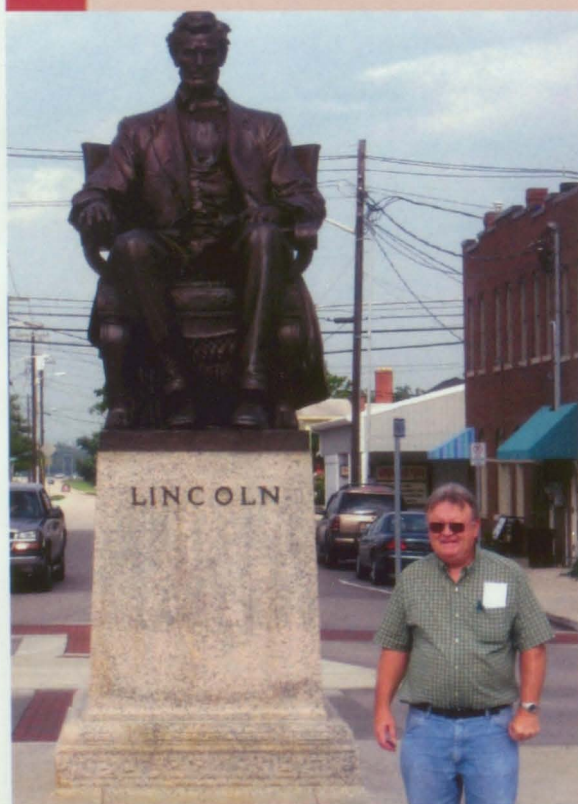

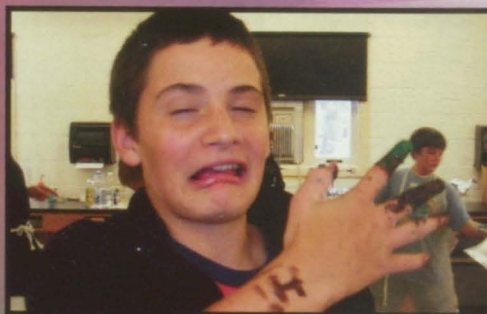

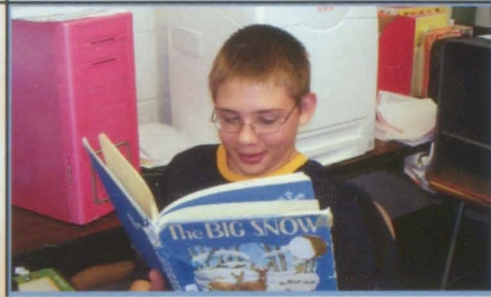

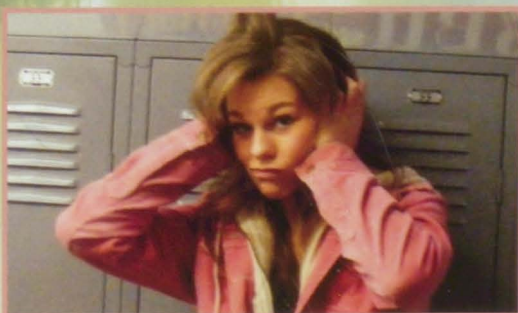

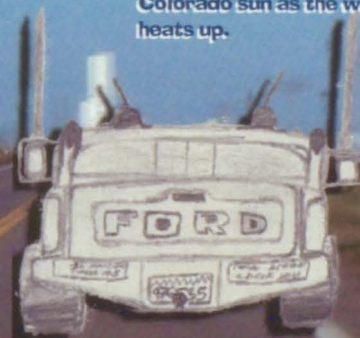

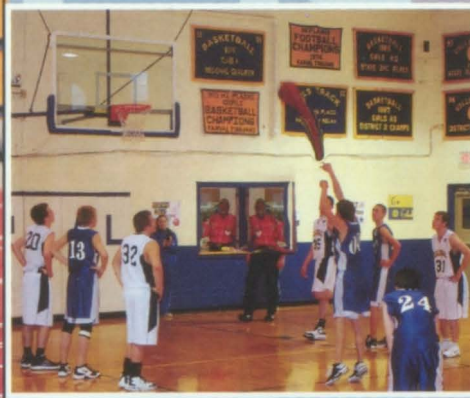

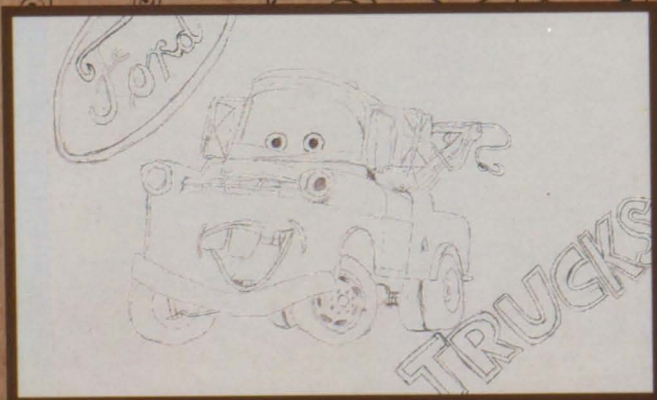

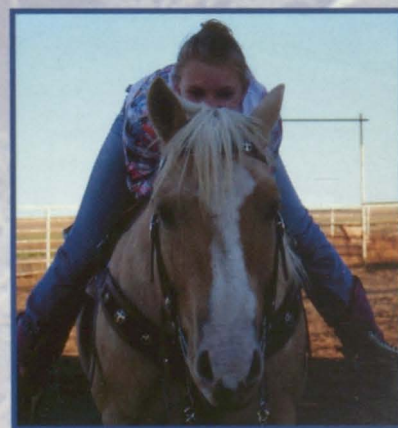

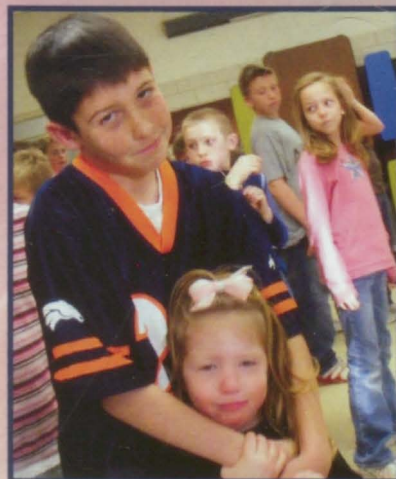

Off with the old, and on with the New

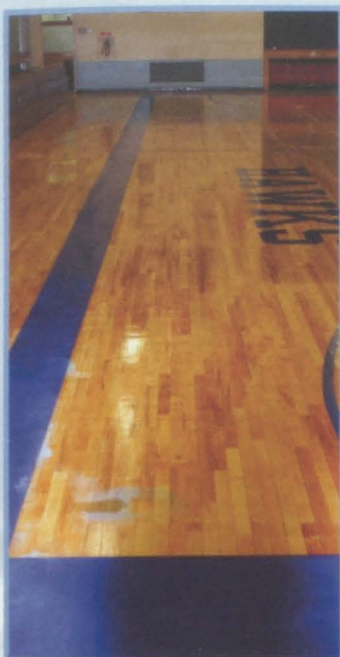
Top cutout: A new sign was also added to Plainview School thanks to a Department of Local Affairs grant applied for by Mr. Coulter and aided by senior Vincent Koeller. **Above:** Roofmaster workers lay down the sheet metal roof over the frame that had been constructed earlier. **At left:** What seemed to be a constant problem throughout the construction process was snow in the winter and rain in the spring that hampered construction efforts and caused lots of problems inside the building with soggy ceiling tiles and wet carpeting. **Below:** One of the first steps in this process was ripping off the old metal roof and sealing the base so as to prevent any more leaks in the future. The aromatic tar is slopped on with a mop.

Above: Installing the soffits around the school required much in the way of attention and detail. **At right:** The new look roof has quite the pitch to it as one can see by the framing underneath.



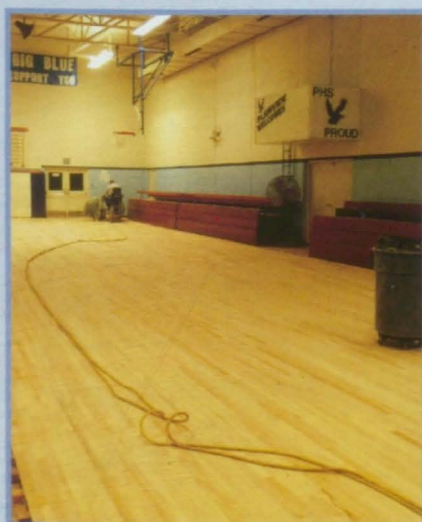


It's a sign: New Floor=New Look

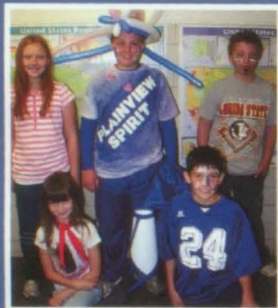

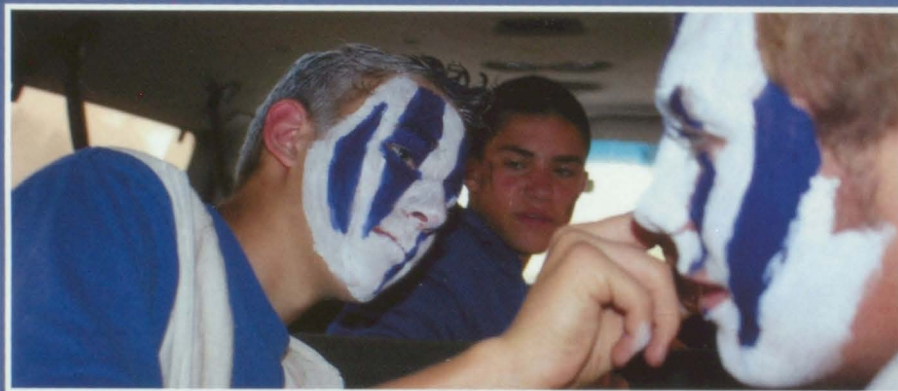

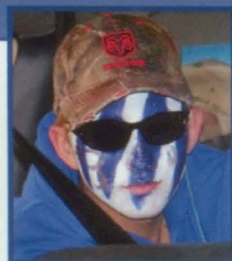

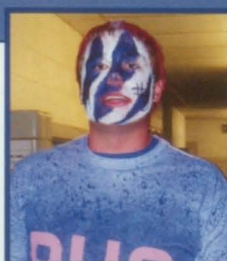

Unstoppable Hawks

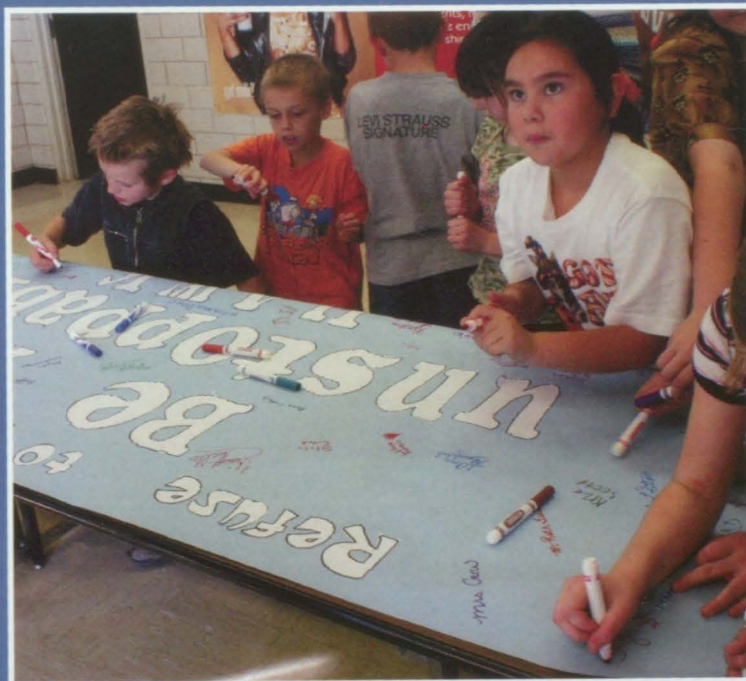

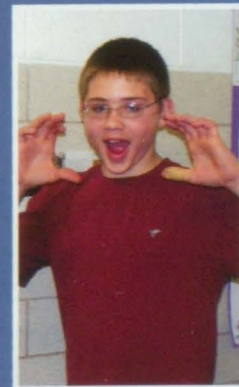

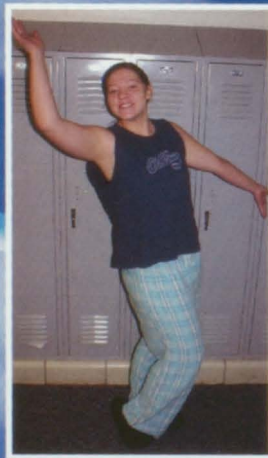

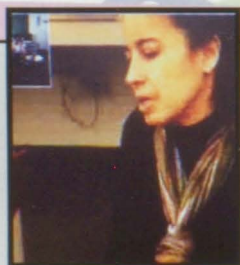

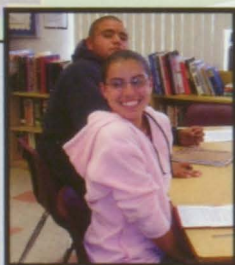

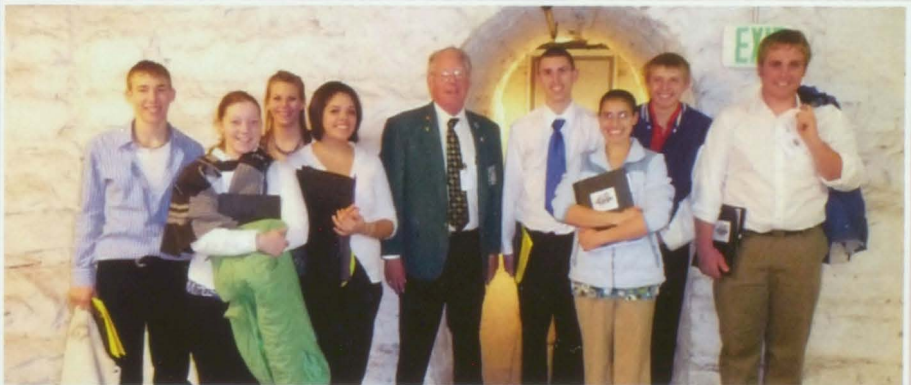

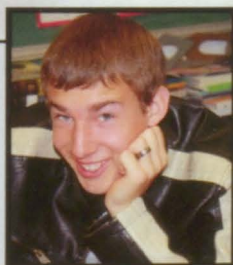

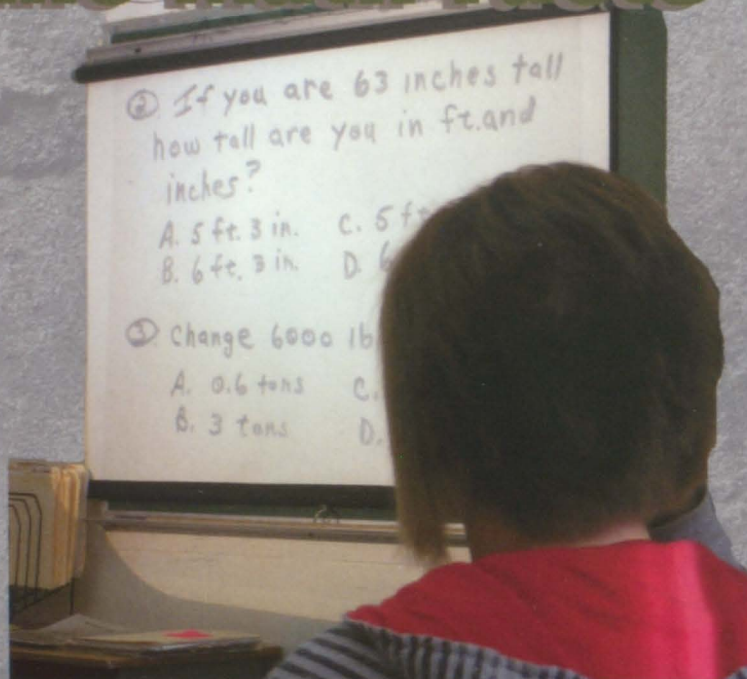

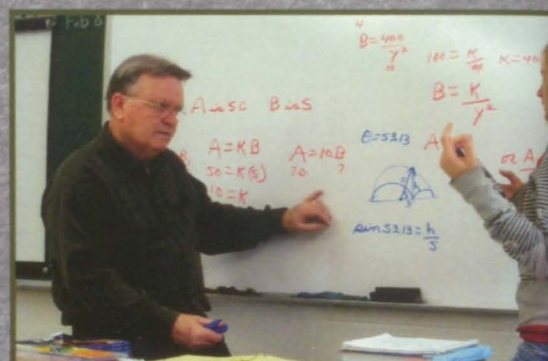

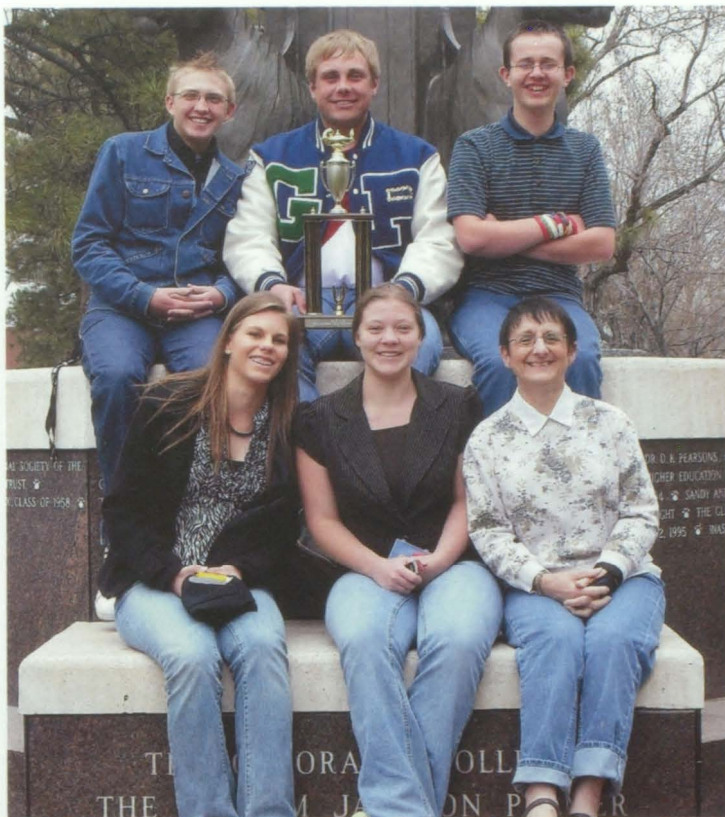

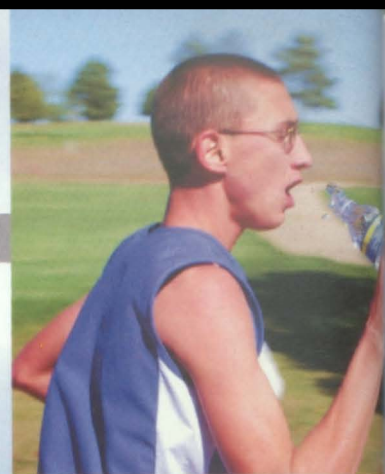

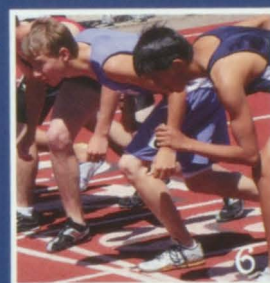

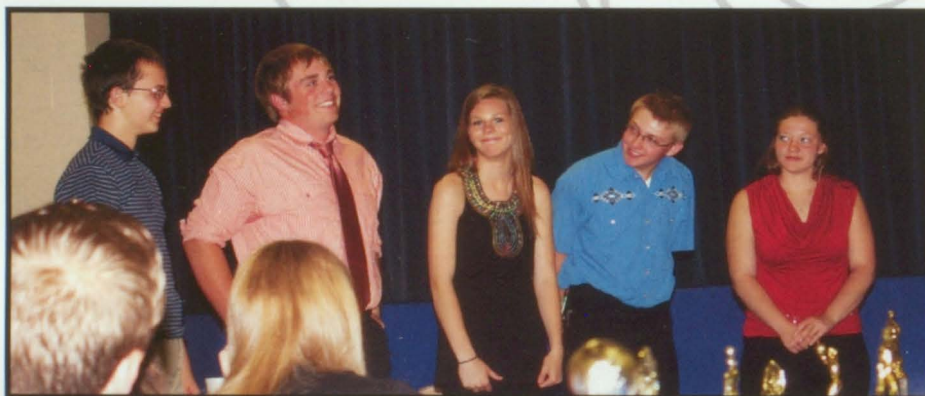

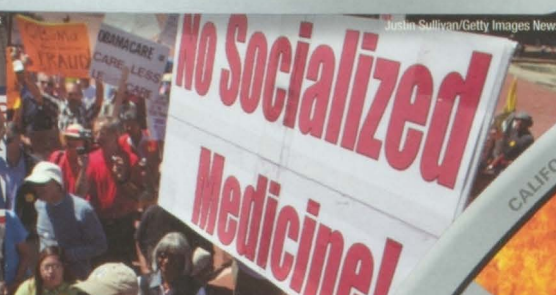

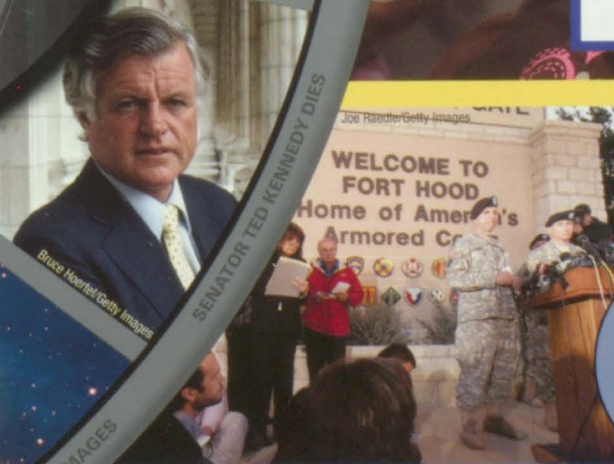
