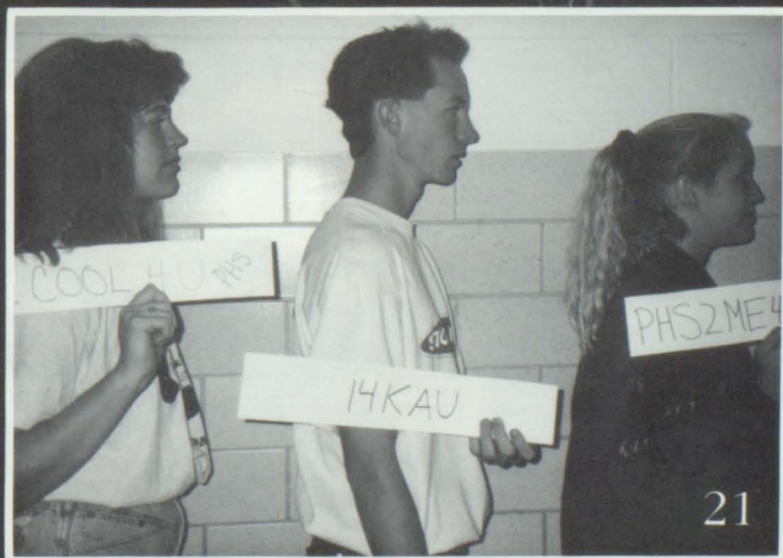
# STUCO ACTIVE IN 94-95

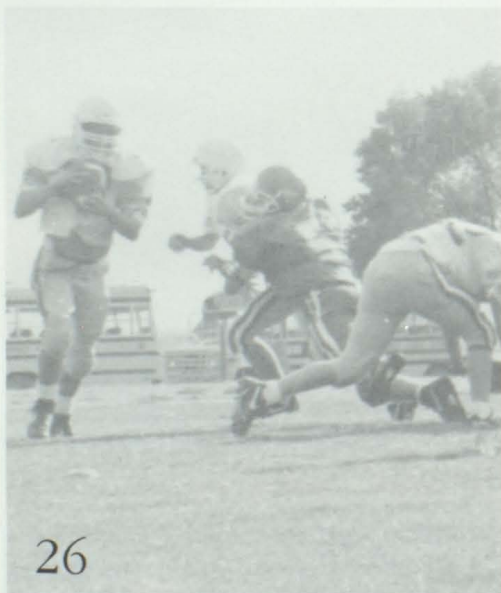
# MOVING UP

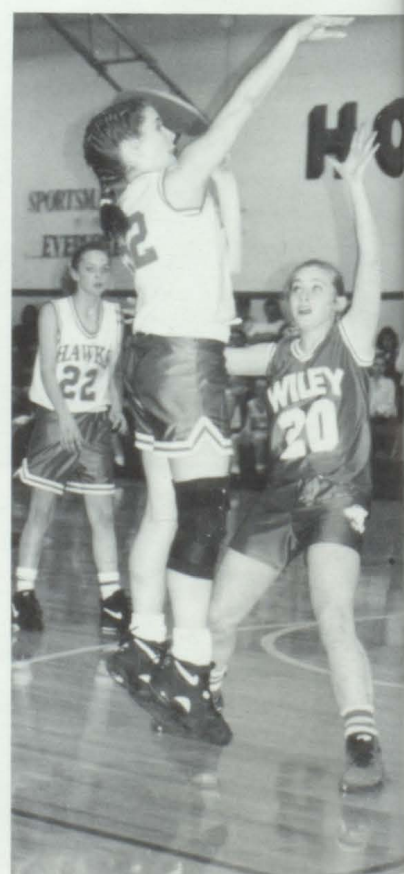

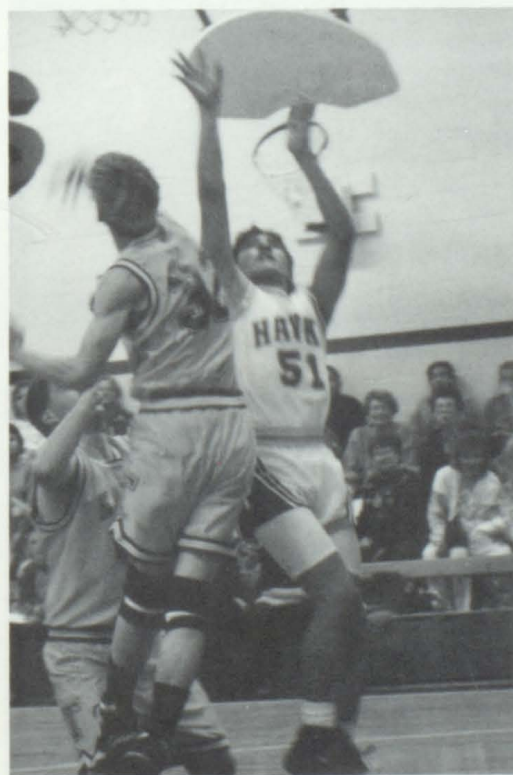

# BAND AND CHOIR PERFORM IN MANY ACTIVITIES

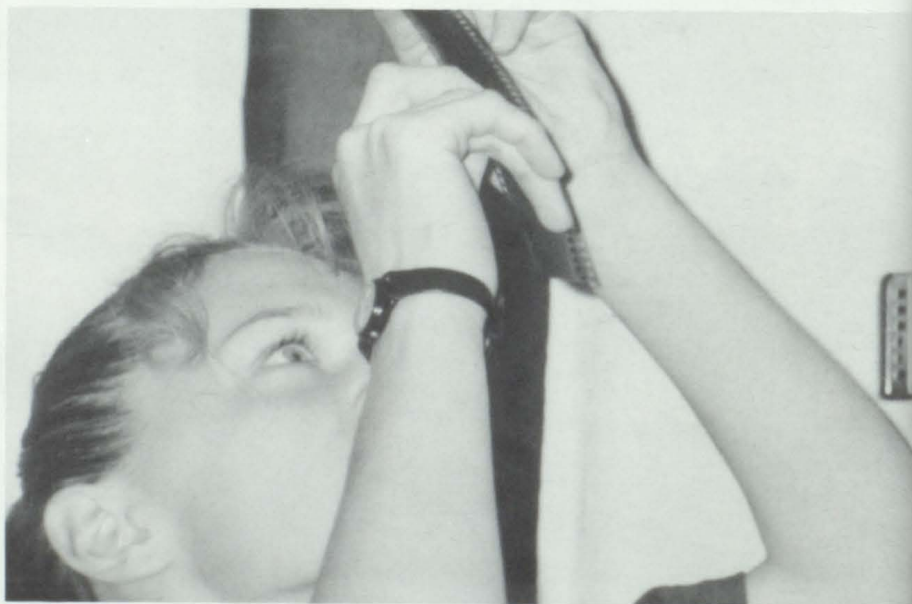

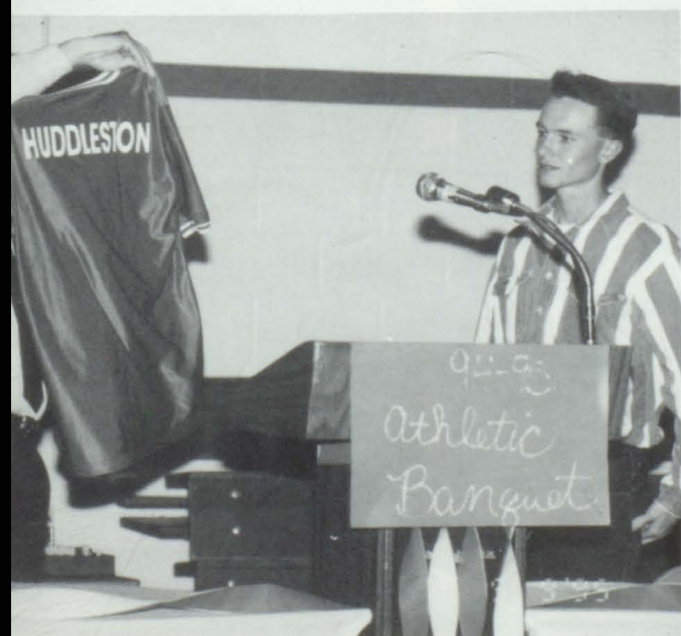




# ATHLETIC BANQUET 1995
